## INTERVIEW INFORMATION

### 1. Where do I go for the Interview?

The interviews will take place at the Parramatta Engineering Innovation Hub, 6 Hassall Street Campus (eastern exit of Parramatta Railway Station). Details will be emailed to you once you have booked an interview .

### 2. What should I bring to the Interview?

- Examples of your designs/ a portfolio (if applicable) can be shown in the interview.
- Your UAC number
- A Passport photograph
- Your completed questionnaires

### 3. What happens at the Interview?

At the interview you will have an opportunity to discuss your experiences with design, what inspires you and your career aspirations. There will also be an opportunity for you to show and explain any materials you have, such as design technology products, artwork or your portfolio. The intention of this interview is to get to know you better so ID staff can formulate an improved delivery accordingly and assist you to better achieve learning outcomes.

### 4. When will I know the results of the Interview?

We are able to give you feedback on your presentation, but will not provide information on offers or refusals of places either at or after the interviews. Offers of a place will be made via UAC or your direct Western application.

### 5. What if I'm not successful?

The best advice is to spend all your spare time after the interview working on your skills and portfolio. You can then apply again when the course is next available.

### 6. If I study Industrial Design or Design and Technology at Western Sydney University, what do I get?

Access to studios, workshop, training in high-quality computer labs, access to a range of rapid prototyping equipment and opportunities to interact with your fellow students. More important than these things, though, you get the benefit of working with highly-trained staff who are all practicing professional industrial designers and researchers across a broad range of design activities, including sustainable design, design management, model making, design thinking and talking about design. You come here to learn from us!

### 7. If I study Industrial Design or Design and Technology at Western Sydney University, what do I do when I'm finished? We

hope that if you complete a degree here, you'll have an excellent basis for working as a professional Industrial Designer: as an industrial designer you could be working in areas such as consumer appliance design, 3D CAD (Computer Aided Design), multimedia, entertainment, design engineering, human computer interaction, human machine interaction, management and sustainability industries, be part of the up and coming green collar economy, and so on.
